Mr. Barlow reported on the fire
insurance. There was a total
of \$7000 on the library, \$2000 on contents
and \$5000 on the building.

A motion was made by Mr. Barlow that
the insurance remain the same
until the end of the year when it will be raised
See Betensen, carried.

A motion we approve of Bills amounting to \$75.68 was made by Mrs Knell. Sec. Betzen

April 20, 1931

May 18, 1931

The Cedar City Library board met in
the city office at 8:00 P.M.

Mrs Knell made a report on books
and cards for Mr Madison.

A motion was made by Mr Belensen
that the committee Mrs Knell & Mr Belensen

be authorized to have it done.

A committee composed of Mayor Granger,
Mr Barlow and Mrs Thorley were appointed
to investigate the cutting of expenses
by eliminating Mr. Bryant and Ada
Webster for the summer.

tables and chairs from Vogen and Andrews
were read and discussed.

Webster read Mrs Watson's letter. It was
discussed.

Mr. Barlow appointed to discuss letters
with Mrs Watson.

Mrs Knell Moved we accept bills

Sept 21, 1931

Minutes were read and approved.

A letter from Mrs. Igerton was read concerning her resignation by the sec. and it was ordered written into the minutes.

Sept 20, 1931

H. R. Granger and Library Board Mem.

Sentiment:-
I cannot conceive of how to execute the painful task, the unlooked for has brought a crushing crisis into my life. Experiences which must end my career as a librarian. For three months I have surmized my physical symptoms but had determined to give you a three months notice so that I could leave the library as I had planned with the few belongings even though it cost my life. My daughter Mrs. Catough came to see her son enter college while I was not at home picked up my diary and came across my recorded fears which resulted in my children unyieldingly insisting that I be subjected to a medical aid immediately.

Following an examination to-day the doctors decided an operation is imperative.

I have served as librarian more than twenty years, seen it grow from its creation. It has been the world I have lived in renouncing social life, sacrificing my church organization meetings enjoying little of family life giving all my energies along every line for the fuller growth of the institution. Had no vacation for five years, eight deaths have occurred in my immediate family during that time but my affords rest on with stoic fever.

Have also enjoyed many educational

advantage my two year summer school courses under nationally known library instructors being outstanding features attendance at lib. conventions in northern and southern California and other states and many other happy experiences.

I am also keenly sensible to that under-current of mis understanding and inferiority complexes undermining confidences which should have lived. Yet my greatest desire was that my dreams for a more complete development of our possibilities should be brought about.

My work is up to date. From now am subject to the doctors.

Mr Barlow moved we pay Mrs Watson her full monthly salary. Sec by Mrs Thorley approved by the board.
