Jan 26 — 1932.

The Public library board met in the city office at 7:00 P.M.

Present Mayor Granger Mrs. Knell, Mrs. Thorley, Mrs. Cory, Mr. Betensen and Mrs. Thibets.

Minutes were read and approved. The new board was discussed. Mayor Granger will make appointments. Bill were read. Mrs. Thorley moved we accept them. unanously.

Mrs. Cory ask for a leave of absence to go to hot springs Arkansas.

Mr. Betensen moved be approve the leave of absence providing she make suitable arrangements to have the library taken care of.

Sec Mrs. Thorley accepted.

A motion made by Mrs. Knell that we subscribe for the Literary Digest if expired with premium for one year. Sec Mrs. Thorley unanously. A motion was made for adjournment.

Mar. 7 1932

The Cedar City library board meet in the city office at 8:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor, Granger, Mr. Betensen, Mrs. Thorley, Mrs. Knell and Evelyn Skelton present.

The Annual report was read.

A motion by Mrs. Knell was made to approve and accept the report as read. Sec. by Mr. Betensen. Motion carried.

Bills were read and approved paid.

Mrs. Thorley made a motion we get the money from the city and pay up all present bills.

motion for adjournment.

April 20, 1932

The Cedar City library board meet in the city office at 8:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor, Granger, Betensen, Thorley, Knell and Skelton.

The minutes were read and approved.

Bills were read by mayor. A motion to approve the bills was made by Mrs. Knell, and to pay them as far as the money lasted. Sec. Thorley. Carried.

Mrs. Knell, Mrs. Thorley, Mrs. Skelton were appointed by the mayor to interview the two librarians and see if some adjustment could not be made to either reduce the two salaries or close the childrens junior library.

A motion for adjournment.

April 25 1932

The Library Board meet in City office  
at 8:00 P.M.

Present Mayor Granger, Mrs. Thorley-Knell,  
Mr. Betensen, Mr. Barlow and Thibault

Mayor Granger conducted. He read a report  
on the financial income of the library from  
the taxes. It presented quite a deficit.

Mrs. Corry ask that a box be placed in  
front of the library and allow people to  
place over due books in it without a  
charge of fines, for three days. It was  
accepted.

Mr. Barlow moved we cut the expenses  
of the girls by discontinuing their services.  
Reduce the janitor five dollars giving him  
fifteen dollars per month; and that the  
Junior library be opened three days a  
week for two hours a day reducing

Mrs. Madson to forty dollars a month.

Mrs. Knell sec. the motion and it passed  
unanimously. A motion was called  
for adjournment.

May 9 1932.

The Cedar City library board meet in the  
B. A. C. library at 2:00 P.M.

Present. Mayor Granger, Mrs. Knell,  
Thorley, Corry, Thibault and King Hendricks.

Minutes were read and approved.

Mayor Granger ask Mr. Hendricks  
to give a report on the condition of  
our library.

Mr. Hendricks recommended three  
things.

1 - Adding a railing around the  
books to keep people from coming  
in contact with books.

May 9 - 1932 continued

- 2 - a recataloguing of all the books.
- 3 - Reclassifying and reorganize the library
- 4 - Cover the magazines with covers to preserve them.

A motion was made by Mrs. Sporley that we carry Mr. Hendricks plan of reorganization out with the understanding that we may have to close the library for one month to cover the cost of it.

It was decided that the library would be closed Sat. night indefinitely for the reorganization.

Mrs. Corry would make a call for all books to be returned by Sat. night.

A motion was made for adjournment.

May 18 1932

The library board meet in a special session in the city library at 8:00 P.M. Present. Mayor Granger, Knell, Betensen, Mr. Barlow and Helbert.

Minutes were read and approved.

Mr. Hendricks suggested that the two libraries should cooperate very closely.

He suggested that he would send a student to take care of the library for four hours a day providing we would allow all B.A.C. students to use our library. A motion was made that we accept his proposition.

The Cedar resident were also to have access to the B.A.C. Library.

Mrs. Corry ask the 6<sup>th</sup> grade books be moved down to the Junior library.

A motion made by Barlow carried that we move the 6<sup>th</sup> grade books down stairs.

The table, sense call cards <sup>to be</sup> printed

Magazine Cards to be printed and the changing of the fire system were very carefully gone into.

Three rules for fines were decided upon.

1 We would charge five cents a day for all past due books.

2 Over due book cards were not allowed to recirculate until fines were paid up.

3 Charge value of lost books the same as price of new book.

Mr Barlow made the motion and Mr Petersen seconded it. It was unanimous. Mrs Knell moved we use and buy the magazine and call cards similar to the ones used by the B. A. C. Sec by Mr Petersen, passed.

Three thousand magazine cards and 10,000 call cards were approved of to buy.

A motion was called for adjournment.

June 11 - 1932.

Library board meet in the Cedar City public library at 2:00 P.M.

Present - Mayor Kranger, Mrs Knell, Mrs Thorley, Mr. Petersen, Mrs Lorry Wall, Betty

Minutes were read and approved.

Motion was made that we advertise for bids for calcagnining as follows.

We will receive bids for calcagnining the upper, large room of the library.

Call at library for information. Bids will be closed on Saturday evening. Motion was made by Mrs Thorley, Sec Petersen

Mr Petersen made a motion we accept the bills amounting to 92.42 and order the secretary & treasurer to pay same. motion for adjournment called.

Aug 8, 1932.

The library board meet in the city library at 8:00 P.M.

Present. Mayor Granger, Mr Barlow Mrs Knell & Mrs Shelton.

Minutes were read and approved.

Bills were read by Mayor Granger and Mr Barlow moved we approve them and order them paid. Sec. Mrs Knell motion carried.

Bids for Galca mining were read and discussed.

Mrs Knell motioned we accept the Millen bid for \$37.50. Barlow sec. carried.

Mr. Barlow moved we give the power of approval for the railing, the door down stairs, the placing of the stands for the catalogue cases and shelving of Junior library down stairs to the mayor.

All the salaries were discussed. The Janitors salary in regards to his duties was discussed but no decision was rendered.

Motion for adjournment called.

Sept 6 - 1932.

The Cedar City library board meet in the public library at 2:00 P.M.

Present Mayor Granger, Mrs Knell Mrs Thorley Mr Barlow Mrs Shelton.

A careful examination of all work completed was made.

Mrs Knell moved we accept the work as it was completed, as very satisfactory. motion passed.

Mr Barlow made a motion that we accept the bills as read by Mr Granger and order them paid. passed.  
a motion to adjournment called.

- Oct Thurs. 1932

The Cedar City public library board meet in the Childrens library at 8.00 P.M.

Present Mayor Granger, Mrs Kestell Mrs Thorley, Thebster, Mrs Barlow, Mr Betensen and the city council.

The minutes were read and approved by a motion made by Mr. Barlow.

A discussion with Mr Dolph Andrews concerning the shelving done a year ago was led by Mrs Granger. Andrews offered to cancel the bill for thirty (\$30) dollars.

Mr Barlow made a motion, we accept the proposition and order the treasurer to pay it. Sec. Betensen unanmously.

Mayor Granger explained the library problems very completely to the city council. He compared the income of 29, 30, 31 explaining what cuts were made and how the board intended to cover the costs for recataloguing and re-renovating the library.

Mr. Barlow moved Mrs Madson be get to work 4 hours per day except on Sundays and holidays and that on the days that the library is opened to the public it be opened promptly at 3.0 P.M and remain opened for three hours.

Dec. 12 - 1932

The Cedar City public library board met in the city office at 7:30 P.M.

Present Mayor Granger, Mrs Knell, Mrs Porter, Mrs DeBeter.

The minutes were read and accepted. The library conditions were carefully discussed and approved of. All things seemed to be running smoothly and in good condition.

The bills were read by Mayor Granger. Mrs Knell made a motion we accept the bills as read & Porter sec. passed.

Mayor Granger told us he would not be here next month, so Leland Perry would act as chairman.

A move for adjournment was accepted.
