Those present were:- Mayor H. H. Lunt, Parley Dalley, Myrtle Janssen, Evelyn Webster, Allie Knell, and librarians Lillian Carry and Ruby Madsen.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. By motion of Evelyn Webster seconded by Myrtle Janssen they were approved.

Mayor Lunt reported that there had been a meeting of the county library board. At that time they decided that the county funds due the cedar city library should be sent to the secretary of the Cedar City library to be used and accounted for from here. The secretary was authorized to phone Will L. Adams, county recorder, to see why this had not been done.

Parley Dalley reported on the fire insurance that expired on December 16th, 1938. After much discussion and explanations, of the two policies submitted by the two agencies of town, Allie Knell made a motion that was seconded by Myrtle Janssen, that the matter be referred to the finance

committee with power to act. Motion carried.
Parley Dally brought up the matter of
shelving for library. It was decided to ask for
prices from local builders.

The bills for the previous month were read
and by motion of Parley Dally, seconded by
Myrtle Jansen, the secretary was authorized to
pay them.

Mrs. Corry requested that we fix the
salary of Lillian Kopp at \$40.00. By motion of
Allie Knell, seconded by Parley Dally her salary
was fixed at \$40.00.

In a discussion on the purchase of genealogy
books it was at first decided to turn the matter
over to the book committee. Later it was thought
best to let the local genealogical societies help
in the purchase of the most expensive ones, as
Mrs. Webster reported that they were willing to
do so.

Myrtle Jansen moved that we express our
appreciation to Mrs. Corry and Mrs. Madsen for
the splendid radio programs they had put on
the air, stating that there had been 60 of these
programs sponsored by them during the year.
The motion was seconded by Parley Dally and
was made unanimous by vote.

Parley Dally made a motion for adjournment

The bills of the past month were read and with the exception of one of the coal bills which the secretary was asked to take up with the city recorder, were approved. The secretary reported that she had contacted Will L Adams, county secretary, and he had said he could not turn over the county funds to the local board unless he obtained the consent of the county commissioners.

Mayor Hunt said he would take the matter up with the county attorney for advisement.

Parley Valley explained the two insurance policies that had been submitted for the approval of the board. By motion of Grace McMullin seconded by Myrtle Janzen,

the board decided to vote on the acceptance of the insurance policy by secret ballot. The Oregon Insurance policy was given the majority vote.

Mrs. Cony presented a letter from Mr. Adams showing our balance with the county at the end of the year. Also the amount of funds from the County for the year 1939. It was \$820.00. She also presented a letter from the Deseret Book Co., explaining the change in postal rates on books. Evelyn Webster reported that they had purchased the genealogical books in question.

Mrs. Madsen reported that she had had some complaints from parents about letting the children read the funny papers. The board instructed her to continue their use. By motion of Myrtle Jansen, seconded by Grace McMullin a meeting will be held at 7:30 until further change.

Mrs. Corry read the expense report for the month, and reported on fines & rentals. Motion for adjournment was made by Parley Valley seconded by Allie Knell. meeting adjourned.

Parley Dally reported that he had examined the furnace at the library and found it needed new grates. He had also inquired regarding pieces on lighting improvements.

By motion of Parley Dally, seconded by Myrtle Jansen the bills for the past month were approved and the secretary authorized to pay them.

Ruby Madsen presented her resignation as assistant librarian to take effect Oct 1st.

By motion of Parley Dally, seconded by Allie Knell her resignation was accepted, with expressions of sincere appreciation for her labors, and with the promise that if she changed her mind in the meantime the place was still open for her.
