sale of the present lib. bldg. and
property, ^{to The Elks Lodge} continue and that we
proceed with plans for the new
Library Bldg. 2nd by Frank Milne
motion passed.

Mr. Farnsworth raised the question
as to the amount of square feet
allowed the American Legion in the
new lib. bldg.

Mr. Wright said he had the signed
agreement that was made out at the
time, of the City purchased the property
from the American Legion and
it said they were to have eight
hundred (800) sq. feet.

Mr. Wright moved that this group
request the City to negotiate with the
American Legion for the purchase
of their holdings in the new library
^{2nd by Mr. Farnsworth} motion carried
bldg., millions of local American


legion Commander agreed to call a meeting of the legion for this purpose. To report result to City Council next meeting.

It was proposed that this corner purchased from the American Legion be made into a Civic Center. That ~~a master~~ plan be made for the future placing of buildings, as they are built so that other units may be added without interference.

Mr. Farnsworth moved that we recommend proceeding with unit 1 of Civic Center by building a library building adequate for future needs. Extra space at present to be used to house relics appropriate of pioneer days also a women's club reading room etc. until needed by library 2nd by Parley Valley motion carried.

It was moved by Frank Milne, 2nd by Sathers Wright that the library board be given a sole of confidence to go ahead with plans for new lib. motion carried.

Plans Complete for Cedar City Library

CEDAR CITY (Special)—Plans were completed this week for Cedar City's new public library and Mayor L. V. Broadbent said bids could be called as soon as financing details can be negotiated.

The new public building is to be constructed on the northwest corner of the intersection 100 West and Center streets on land acquired five years ago. It will replace the

present Carnegie library at 30 N. Main street, proceeds from the sale of which will be used to help finance the proposed building.

The only library building has been considered inadequate for a number of years and was sold in 1949 to the local Elks club. The new library will be "L" shaped, one story, full basement structure facing south. It will be 153 ft. long and 53 ft. wide on the west wing.

In addition to the main reading room and stack space for current editions, the ground floor will provide a complete children's library with separate stacks and a fireplace, a rare book room, librarians' office and workroom and charge desk.

The entrance vestibule will contain a war memorial plaque in honor of the community's service men and a sign panel of native marble. An elevator will connect the librarian's work room and the basement. The entire east wing of the basement will provide additional stack space. Also in the base-

ment will be a 900-sq. ft. meeting room for the library board and other small groups, the heating plant and receiving, cataloguing and mending rooms.

for book stacks and light from windows.

months ago were studied and as
