Henry Grow was the man who planned and built the Dome Roof of the Salt Lake Tabernacle. He was a bridge builder by trade, and was the man who built the first two bridges that withstood the floods, one over the Weber River, the other over the Jordan River. These were built after what was called the Remington pattern . They were braced and put together with wooden pins and when President Brigham Young saw the bridges, he asked my grandfather, Henry Grow if he could pattern a roof after that style and he told him yes so he was put to work at it. He worked on and superintended the work of the the Dome roof, also of the Assembly Hall, ZCC.M.I. and many other structures, he also assisted in construction of the Temple.
